
Monthly Air Quality Report November 2022 · Birmingham, AL



SUMMARY

This report presents daily maximum Air Quality Index (AQI) values and corresponding AQI colors from five different pollutants monitored in the Birmingham area: carbon monoxide (CO), particulate matter (PM_{10} and $PM_{2.5}$), ozone (O₃), and sulfur dioxide (SO₂). The table and figure below show the number of days and percentage of days in each AQI category, respectfully, for the month.

AIR QUALITY ALERTS

Air quality alerts are issued for days that are forecast to have AQI values greater than 100 for O₃ and/or PM_{2.5}. O₃ is forecast by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management from about mid-April through mid-October. PM_{2.5} is forecast by the Jefferson County Department of Health year-round.

No air quality alerts were issued in November. There have been 0 air quality alerts issued in 2022 through November.
