

# Monthly Air Quality Report

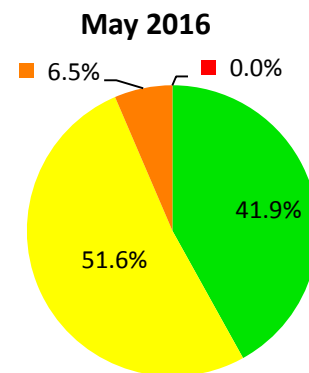
## May 2016 · Birmingham, AL



### SUMMARY

This report presents daily maximum Air Quality Index (AQI) values and corresponding AQI colors from five different pollutants monitored in the Birmingham area: carbon monoxide (CO), particulate matter (PM<sub>10</sub> and PM<sub>2.5</sub>), ozone (O<sub>3</sub>), and sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>). The table and figure below show the number of days and percentage of days in each AQI category, respectfully, for the month.

## AIR QUALITY ALERTS

Air quality alerts are issued for days that are forecast to have AQI values greater than 100 for O<sub>3</sub> and/or PM<sub>2.5</sub>. O<sub>3</sub> is forecast by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management from mid April through mid October. PM<sub>2.5</sub> is forecast by the Jefferson County Department of Health year-round.

The table below shows air quality alerts that were issued for this month and includes the date of the alert, the pollutant for which the alert was issued, and the AQI category that was forecast. There has been 1 air quality alert issued in 2016 through May.

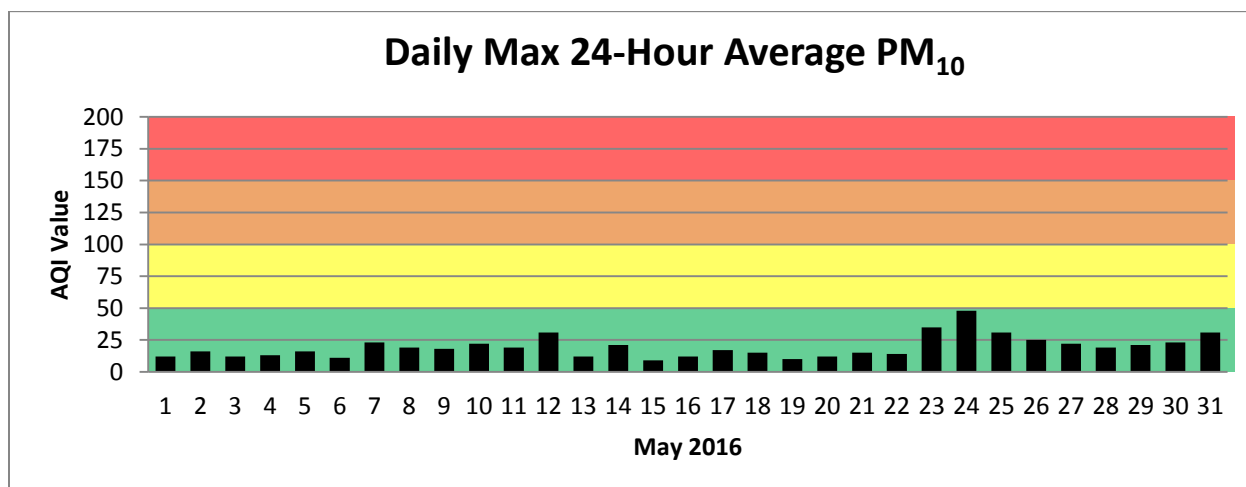
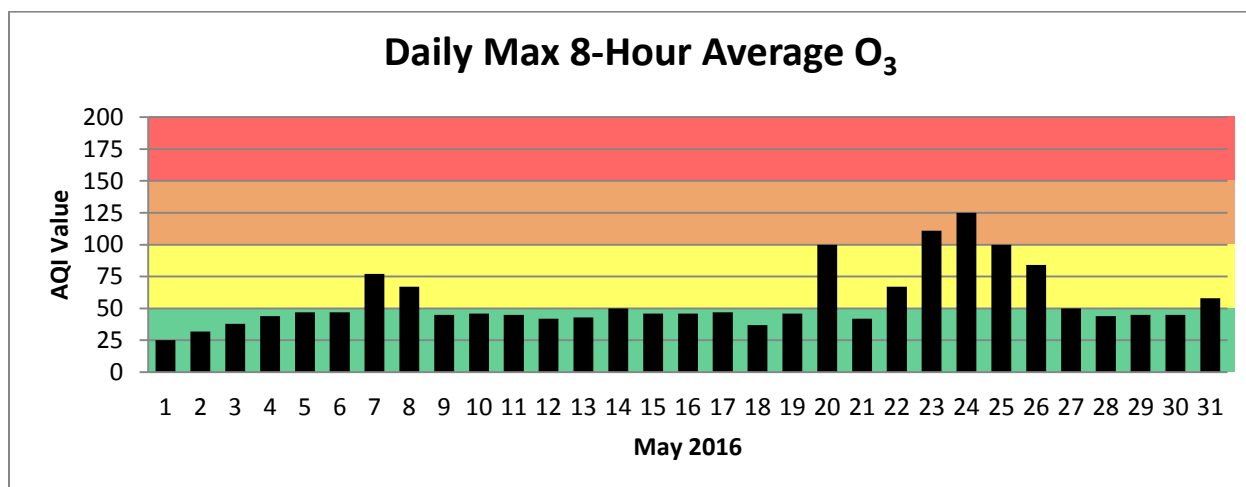
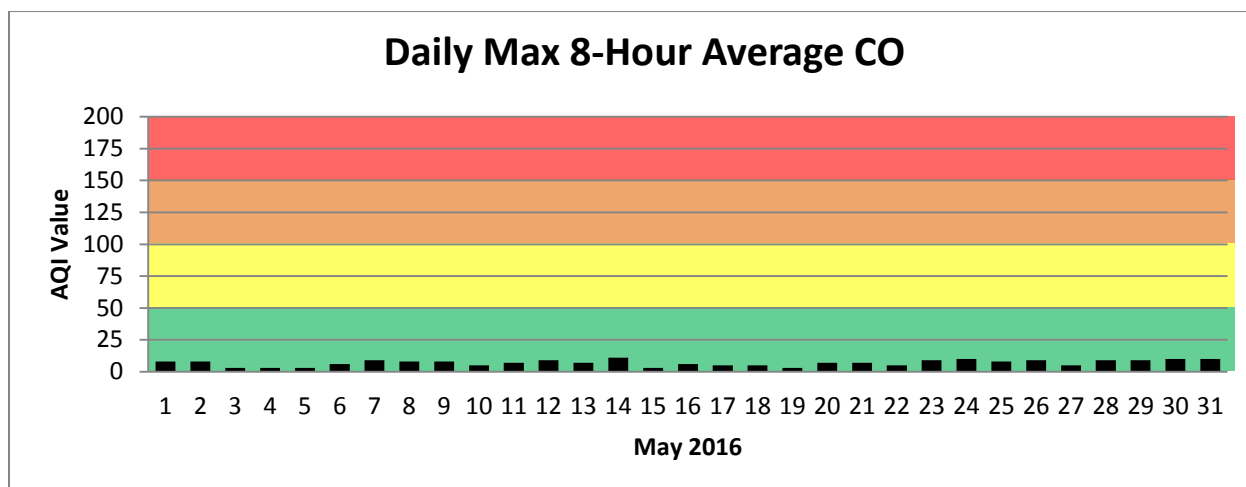

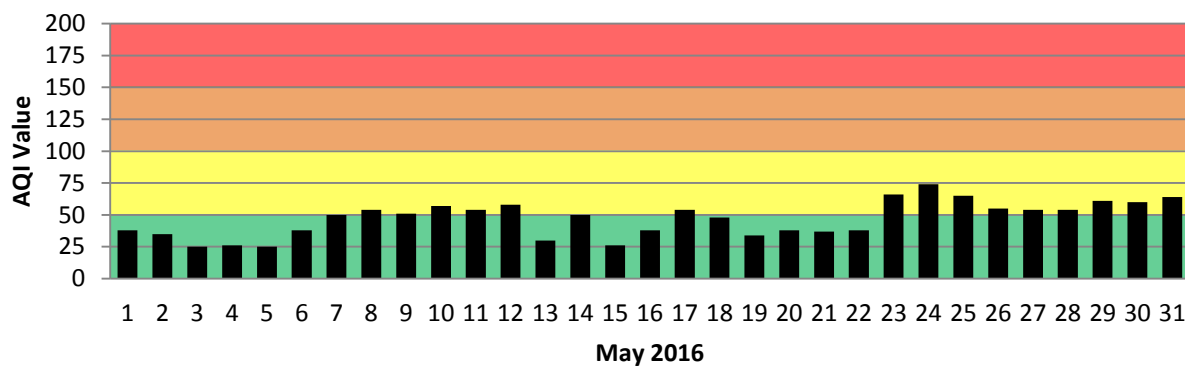
